#### **Obituary of Nahum King Descendant**

LaVetta M. Willoughby Aug. 27, 1917-May 15, 1996

LaVetta M. Willoughby of Corvallis died Wednesday at Oak Crest Rehabilitation Center in Salem. She was 78. She was born in Dallas, the daughter of Randall and Myrtle (Ramsdell) Greossor. She was a great-great-granddaughter of the pioneers Nahum and Sarepta Norton King, who came to Oregon on the last "Meek" wagon train. She is survived by her children, Maxine Sprick of Corvallis, Clovis DeLieu of San Diego, Calif., Rose Ward of Covina, Calif.; sisters Lois Bancroft of Dallas and Maxine Blaumer of Keizer, six grandchildren, five great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren, several nieces and nephews.

Graveside services will be today at 2 p.m. at Crystal Lake Cemetery. McHenry Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

# Kith and Kin By Charlene Talbot

For genealogists poll taxes have a far more specific meaning than the association some of us were brought up with, that poll taxes were the way Southerners kept poor blacks from voting. Apparently the word comes from "poll" meaning "head" and only indirectly from voting polls. Over the centuries, governments have thought of many things to tax -- land, slaves, watches and windows, tea and documents, cigarettes and liquor. Only comparatively recently has it become possible to keep track of citizens well enough to tax incomes. We have been lucky to be doing

some of our research in Kentucky records, where county poll

tax lists were kept from 1790 through the middle of the 19th century. The books say that 21 years was usually the age when men began paying poll taxes, as well as being the age when a young man could make contracts, buy land, vote, marry, etc. However, in the books the cases are always straightforward. Unlike our ancestor John. John began paying poll tax in 1827. So we assume he was 21 years old. He isn't listed as owning any property such as a horse or a slave, which sometimes caused young men to have to pay poll tax before they reached age 21. He paid poll tax again in 1828, but skipped 1829. The tax collector apparently did not get around that year.

By the time of the 1830 census John should have been 24. He is listed as head of a household, between 20 and 30. But in the 1840 census, he is still listed as between 20 and 30, when he should have been 34. And in the 1850 census he claims to be 40, not 44. Incidentally, his wife is listed as being age 50. Unfortunately, the books don't tell you what to do when the figures don't agree. But it's one of the things that makes genealogy fascinating, and makes the statistics turn into people. Did John look younger than his age? Did he deliberately choose to whittle a few years off? Or did two census takers ten years apart make the same mistake? Surely John didn't start paying taxes back in 1827 before he had to. Or are we wrong somewhere in our conclusions? Surely not that! Actually, one book in our Society's excellent collection, on the writing of family histo-

ries, did say that when there was conflicting evidence, a genealogist should say so, and explain why. The conclusion:

NOT EVEN DEATH AND TAXES ARE SURE.
