Kith and Kin By Charlene Talbot

Webster's New 20th Century Unabridged Dictionary defines the phrase "kith and kin" as one's "friends, acquaintances and kinsfolk, now often restricted to mean only kinsfolk." We're unrestricting it. In explanation of this sudden appearance, the editors felt that recruiting a columnist would make the newsletter look less like it was written by one person, so here goes:

DON'T TAKE INDEXES AS THE LAST WORD

An index is good if you're lucky, but if your ancestor isn't listed, what then? We had an ancestor who should have been in the 1850 census in Worcester County, Massachusetts. Only he wasn't in the index. Since the 1850 census listed everyone in the household, we eventually figured that he and his family might have been boarding with someone else. The 1850 Worcester County census covers several reels of film. When we began this search there was no book that listed which towns or electoral districts the reels covered, as there is now, so we eventually ended up sending to the Family History Center in Salt Lake City for all six reels. And, of course, the town where we thought he ought to be was on the last reel. But there he was there, on the second page, with his wife, children, and mother-in-law. Somehow the indexer had overlooked them.

Another, more recent attempt at finding someone in an index came when another ancestor and his family disappeared from Campbell County, Kentucky in 1869. We could find no evidence that he died, and even if he had, what became of the rest of the family? Indexes for 1870 censuses are pretty scarce but there are some CDs available, so we tried the Internet. Sure enough, some kind soul sent us a list of all the Thomas Parishes and Martha Jane Parishes in a variety of states, including counties, townships and page numbers. We filled out the LDS form called "Request for Photocopies," added the film numbers from the book at our local Family History Center, and send two dollars to Salt Lake City. (Incidentally, this is the best bargain that we know of. For two dollars one can get eight photocopies.) Altogether we sent for 16 possible Thomas or Martha Parishes. None was the right family. Only then did we look again at the Index. It said, selected counties. So much for that index! Yes, we found "our" Thomas Parish thanks to a 1932 obituary of a nephew, who, luckily for us, hadn't married. His only survivor was an uncle, Charles Parish, in Farmersburg, Indiana. This was a totally new person, but he had to be the son of Thomas, born after the 1860 census. Sure enough, there in Sullivan County, Indiana, we found him, plus his parents and the rest of the family. *So, if the person you want is in the index -- great! If not, don't give up.*
