MINUTES: Wendy took minutes in the absence of Secretary Janice. Daniel read the minutes of the last meeting in Janice's absence.

PROGRAM (Jim): January's speaker has been rescheduled to April (missed due to snow). For February, Judy Juntunen will present the records extraction project on the Museum's computer; Ed, Becky and Judy are currently active on the project, and we are encouraged to join them. March's program will be a demonstration of Ed's computerized film equipment and features; we are encouraged to bring a photograph for the demonstration. April's program will be Margaret Ingram from Albany speaking about her recently published book.
