- (1) Mildred Bradley donated a copy of the Yorkshire Family Historical Society publication.
- (2) According to Timber Trails, a publication out of Yamhill County, Ore., the Department of Commerce Census of 1890 was burned in a fire and, except for very few schedules, was destroyed. This fire took place in 1921 when, for some reason, the 1890 schedule was outside of the vault.
- (3) Merthel McConnel requested assistance from the Benton County Historical Museum with property abstracts, photographs, buildings, towns and pioneer families of Benton County, Kings Valley, Summit, etc.

The program was given by Mr. William Boundy who gave a slide presentation of his visits to his ancestral town of Cornwall, England entitled, Going Home Again. It was a most interesting program and was enjoyed by all.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
