10 September 1988

Jane Dodge spoke about an open house of an early farm home at the Findlay Wild Life Refuge, Sunday, September 18th, 12-4 p.m.

Danell Knight showed the micro-fiche reader, donated by our president, and mentioned what materials were available for use.

John Matuszak reported on LDS computer data.

Danell Knight announced that the Surname file booklet would soon be ready.

There was discussion on obtaining a P. O. Box; matter was deferred.

John Matuszak announced that he would be absent until Thanksgiving; Lee Rudisill will take over the treasurer's job. Annual dues of \$4.00 are payable before January.

Elizabeth Akins announced her beginning genealogy class through LBCC; Edna Wiese mentioned her writing class.

The meeting was adjourned. Summer experiences were recounted by members following the adjournment.
